PART 3 Project Implementation

In this part of module 3, we are going to explore Beneficiary and Community Engagement in **Project Implementation**.

In your project design, you should have an implementation plan regarding *project activities, when* and *where* they will be implemented, the *supplies, resources, and labour* required, and *who* will be involved.

You must engage the community in this implementation plan so that *they are aware and can help to shape the various aforementioned aspects*.

They may have their own ideas about where and when is best to implement the project so that:

1. It does not interfere with ongoing agricultural seasons
2. It does not interfere with school terms or semesters
3. It does not overlap with pre-existing aid project assistance and other livelihood factors.

This is also an opportunity to promote the humanitarian **Do No Harm** principle to ensure that you and your aid organization *do not create any social tensions between beneficiaries or communities* and to *minimize any harm you may inadvertently cause through providing aid*.
